

**BRIEF BIOGRAPHY OF PROFESSOR DR. MOHAMED 'ARAF**

Mohamed 'Arafa, is an Assistant Professor of Criminal Law and Criminal Justice at Alexandria University Faculty of Law (Egypt) and an Adjunct Professor of Law teaching Islamic Law and Middle Eastern Legal and Political Studies at Indiana University Robert H. McKinney School of Law (USA). Professor 'Arafa earned his Bachelor of Laws (LL.B.) degree from Alexandria University Faculty of Law (English Department), Egypt in 2006, his Masters of Laws degree (LL.M.) in American Criminal Law and Criminal Justice from the University of Connecticut School of Law in 2008, and his Doctor of Juridical Science (SJD) from Indiana University Robert H. McKinney School of Law in 2013. He was teaching in the last couple of years in Italy (Turin Law School), the Netherlands (University of Groningen), Tunisia, Croatia, Qatar, among many others. He teaches and regularly invited to international conferences and symposia also in various law schools in the United States including George Washington University (Washington DC), Washington University in St. Louis (Missouri), University of Illinois (Illinois), and Texas A&M University (Dallas), among many others. This Spring and Summer semesters of 2016, he has been invited to teach Islamic Law, Comparative Law, Transitional Justice, and Middle Eastern Legal and Political Studies (Arab Spring Course) as a Visiting Assistant Professor at the University of Brasilia in Brazil and University of Rijeka in Croatia (Zagreb).

He authored several law reviews articles in numerous U.S. and European journals on Corruption and Anti-bribery Law; Anti-Money Laundering Law; Economic, White-Collar, and International Crimes; Islamic Law; Islamic Criminal Law; Comparative Criminal Law; Middle Eastern and Egyptian Politics. Most recently his book published in Germany by Lambert Academic Publishing (entitled: *Towards a New Anti-Corruption Law in Egypt After Mubarak: A Comparative Study Between the United States Foreign Corrupt Practices Act, Egyptian Anti-Bribery Law, and Islamic Law*, <http://www.amazon.com/Towards-Anti-Corruption-Egypt-After-Mubarak/dp/3659396141>). Furthermore, Professor 'Arafa focuses his teaching and scholarship in the areas of Criminal Law; Advanced Criminal Procedures; Corporate Crimes; White Collar Crimes; Criminal Evidences, and Forensic Science; Criminology and Penology; Therapeutic Jurisprudence ("TJ"); Islamic Law; Islamic Criminal Law; International Criminal Law; International Human Rights Law, Transitional Justice, and Humanitarian Law. Professor 'Arafa is also a Visiting Professor of Business Law at the Arab Academy for Science, Technology, and Maritime Transport (College of Business Management). Moreover, Professor 'Arafa is a permanent member of The Arab Society for Commercial and Maritime Law (ASCML); Council on International Law and Politics (Chicago); The American Bar Association (ABA); The American Bar Association (ABA) Dispute Resolution, Business Law, and Educational Committees Program; and The Egyptian American Rule of Law Association (EARLA) in Washington DC. Recently, he qualified and was certified as a Civil and Domestic Mediator under Indiana Alternative Dispute Resolution (A.D.R.) Rule 25. In addition, he recently has been named to the editorial board of the *UNITED STATES-CHINA LAW REVIEW* as an "Honored Reviewer." The review is published by David Publishing Company and the Editor-in-Chief of the *ARAB LAW QUARTERLY JOURNAL* in London published by Brill Publishing Company.
